
CONVENTION UPDATE


The winner of each category will receive two tickets to a performance, the date and time to be determined by SPA. Tickets are non-tranferrable and have no cash value.

Blaney Awarded Lifetime Achievement Fellowship Award

Here's a lovely report from your friend and mine, Walter "Zaney" Blaney:

"The Academy of Magical Arts (AMA), in conjunction with The Magic Castle, held their annual Magic Awards Show in the beautiful Saban Theater in Hollywood Sunday evening, May 17th. On the show they make various awards to the winning acts who have appeared at The Magic Castle during the past year, much like the Oscar Awards Show for

the movie industry. And they also make several "Magic Fellowship Awards" to a few special individuals in the magic world who have excelled in their own special fields in magic.... like Performing Fellowship, Literary Fellowship, Masters Fellowship.

My daughter Becky and I flew out to the event, and the AMA officers

comped us with our plane fare, hotel, private transportation. They treated us like kings.

On the show I was awarded the LIfetime Achievement Fellowship Award. Seen below is a copy of the award as it appeared in the program. This is considered as one of the top awards in the magic world, and I was honored and extremely happy to receive it.

The show producers arranged for my longtime pal in magic (since we were nine years old) Mark Wilson, and his wife Nani, to appear on stage to introduce me and give a bit of history on my career in magic. Then I told a few stories about Bill and Milt Larsen, founders of both the AMA and The Magic Castle. In my three minute acceptance speech I vanished the Blaney Birdcage five times to fit the points I was making.

The crowd always loves this famous old piece of magic. It's one of my signature tricks and I think was a good choice in those few moments in the limelight. The show closed with several terrific magic acts from around the world. Then the whole crowd retreated to the Magic Castle to be royally wined and dined. As the old saying goes, a good time was had by all.
