


BEN JACKSON PRESENTS Magic, Music, & Mayhem

MAGIC AT THE GASLIGHT




Mike Squires headlines shows at The IMPROV in Arlington on alternate Saturdays. Mike will casually blow your mind. Doors open at 1:00.

S.A.M. has a new insurance policy that is much better than the previous one offered. Here are some numbers!

Old policy with Specialty Insurance; rate was \$283. The new carrier is PEEP Insurance Agency (Performing Entertainers & Event Professionals) and costs \$175 for the same coverage. The General Liability limits are \$1,000,000 per occurrence with a \$2,000,000 aggregate. Donald Billings 1943-2019

Long-time TAOM member Donald Billings passed away on March 5, 2019 at his home in Houston at the age of 75.

Don was a dedicated and devout Mason his entire life. He became a Demolay at the age of 13. In 1968 he was raised to Third Degree Master Mason. Later Don became an Arabian Shriner and held numerous staff positions. In 1973, Don devoted his passion to becoming a Arabia Shrine Clown.

He would go on to spend 41 years with the Shrine Circus. On August 30th 2018, he became a 50 year Master Mason.

Don held a passion for magic. In addition to TAOM, he was a member of the Houston Association of Magicians and Ring 39 of the International Brotherhood of Magicians. In earlier years, he performed frequently at hospitals and for charity events. He often performed and lectured at magic club meetings. At the HAOM Annual Installation Banquet and Show In 2017, he received the prestigious Lifetime Achievement Award from I.B.M. Ring 39.

Don is survived by his loving wife Darla, three children, and four grandchildren.





FAREWELL, JOHNNY THOMPSON

Johnny Thompson, who was revered among magicians not only for his own deft performances but also as a teacher, advicegiver and historian of the field, died on March 9 in Las Vegas. He was 84. the cause was complications of respiratory failure.

Johnny, whose colorful résumé also included stints playing bass harmonica with Jerry Murad's Harmonicats, was well known to casino, cruise ship and television audiences as the Great Tomsoni, a pompous caricature of a magician. His act, full of deadpan humor and often performed with his wife, Pamela Hayes, as his indifferent assistant, left spectators laughing so much that they might not have fully appreciated that they were also seeing expertly executed tricks.

Magicians and audiences around the world are laughing and crying -- remembering the great joy he brought and sad that he is no more.

MARSHALL BRODIEN So long, Wizzo

Beloved Chicago celebrity, Marshall Brodien (84) passed away peacefully early morning on March 8, 2019. He may be best known for creating the Marshall Brodien Magic sets and TV magic cards with his famous tagline, "Magic is easy, once you know the Secret."



He's also fondly remembered as the magical, wacky character Wizzo on Chicago's Bozo Show for 26 years. Marshall, aka Wizzo, would wave his stone of Zanzibar and say the magic words, "Do-dee-do-dee-do".

He was drafted into the army in 1957 and commissioned to the Special Services Entertainment Division at Fort Carson, Colorado. He performed more than 700 shows at hospitals, officer's clubs, and private parties over his two years in the military. arshall continued entertaining by performing magic and stage hypnosis at lounges, clubs, and county fairs as well working as a trade show spokesperson for corporations such as Owens-Corning Fiberglass, Bethlehem Steel, Reynolds Aluminum, and the American Gas Association.

Marshall's charisma and gentle spirit drew people to him from all walks of life. Fans, neighbors, and long and short time acquaintances called him friend, because that is how he treated everyone he met. He wouldn't hesitate to stop and talk or offer a tour through his home museum. Well-mannered and thoughtful, caregivers testified to his gratitude for their assistance until the very end.



Practice Time

<u>Any</u> time is the right time to practice your magic. The best tool you can use to improve your skills is a video. Watching the moves, listening to each word, and making minor adjustments can made the difference between an "OK" performance and an outstanding one.
